





#### **ABOUT THE ARTISTS**



For around 40 years Victoria Cooper and Doug Spowart produced numerous artists books and photobooks both as individuals and in collaboration.

They have a deep affinity with all forms of the book and visual reading. Through this medium they continue to experiment and explore the photographic and poetic narrative potential of books.

Their work has been acquired for the artists' books, rare book and manuscript collections in many private, regional and state public galleries, national and international collections including the British Library. Both Cooper and Spowart have judged photobook awards, presented lectures and contributed to photobook review panels in Australia.

Ten years ago they completed individual PhD studies in photography, photobooks and artists books. Since their academic studies, they have received individual Siganto Research Fellowships at the Australian Library of Art, State Library of Queensland to research aspects of this seminal artists books collection.

They have published and presented papers on the contemporary photobook and artists' books at national and international forums. Doug's research on Australian and New Zealand Photobooks was featured at the Vienna Photobook

Festival and recently he has completed the curation of a collection of ANZ photobooks to be included alongside the Martin Parr collection at Tate Britain.

Desire Paths is based on our ongoing work to locate ourselves in Place and Land as a shared and more-than-human space. In this exploration of the concept we embark on a journey that inhabits new directions and spaces. Beyond the concrete we meander and traverse the unknown, sometimes challenged by our choices of path, while also experiencing the freedom to be.

Desire Paths also relates to our book making process as a set of turns. The peaks and valleys of the concertina format provides dimension and space for the journey from many perspectives of reading: sometimes leading to dead ends but always seeking to arrive at a different conclusion.

#### VISUAL FIELD NOTES: Trees & Grasses of the North East By Victoria Cooper

We arrived in Benalla during one of the long Covid 19 lockdowns of Victoria. We emerged from our mandatory two-week home quarantine to find ourselves under a state wide travel restriction to residents of only 5kms from their homes. So walking became our way of exploring our new locality.

On these walks, and later on longer journeys, I was captivated by the remnants of natural environment at the edge of the suburban spaces, roadsides and bushland. Here in the North East the trees tower like epic monuments to a pre-colonial history, the grasses cover the ground in a visual chaos of light and texture.

The Visual Field Notes are momentary glimpses and spatial fragments of these explorations. The making of this book begins a process that over time creates a deeper knowledge and knowing of and connection to Place. This and future Visual Fields Notes will form a record where I contemplate and question my place in the philosophical context of Being-in-the-world.

# THE CENTRE FOR REGIONAL ARTS PRACTICE\* and C.R.A.P.

For around 25 years we have operated an art practice in regional Australia. Previously we lived and worked in Brisbane – a place that in many ways could also be considered in a 'regional' context.

During a residency at the Bundanon Trust in 2007, we had the time to consider our place as regional artists. Our conversations around these issues inspired us to establish the Centre for Regional Arts Practice, (acronym C.R.A.P.) and, as artists' book makers, we saw the opportunity to produce a democratic multiple to present our perspective on the regional artist experience and to develop C.R.A.P. manifestoes.

We produced little handmade books in the form of a survey that asked the reader to identify with the issues of being a regional artist. The Artists Surveys are produced in A5 sized codex format mainly in editions of 25 with 5 artist's proofs.

The C.R.A.P. books were initially made with hand-set rubber letter texts onto art papers sourced from the seconds or damaged sale tables in local art supply shops. Later editions utilised digital output or desktop inkjet printing technologies and recycled or repurposed materials from other sources.

The books draw upon humour and irony of the prosaic routines and events encountered in the life of a regional artist.

Each Survey book was made in response to different concerns or events, for example: Swine Flu; Global Financial Crisis; Extractive Mining Industries; ant infestations of art studio; flood events and collaborative productions with a regional artist living in Thailand, a group of regional artists in Northern NSW and one of an event with Toowoomba artists.

Over the last fifteen years, C.R.A.P. and its Artists Survey books have become a vehicle for highlighting, critiquing and questioning many issues both local and global affecting regional artists.



#### **BEING PRESENT**

A Zine by Victoria Cooper

Being Present has its physical origins from an artist-in-residence undertaken at the Bundanon Trust on the Shoalhaven River near Nowra in southern NSW. In this book I traverse the microscopic and human experience of land and space. The visual/text narrative refers to my life long awareness of the living earth: land/air/water and the short moment of deep time of human habitation.

The electron microscopic images come from unexplored work made during an earlier Bundanon artists-in-residence in 2007 of collected detritus from the Shoalhaven River. The montages were constructed with these microscopic images as interventions into a riparian environment near the property.

The book is informed by the work of notable writers, thinkers and philosophers, Martin Heidegger and Rachel Carson.
